

## “WALK AS ONE” WORSHIP MUSIC PACK #2 - CONTENTS

The Centre for Music, Liturgy and the Arts are pleased to introduce the second of our new worship music packs for churches. While many churches and leaders purchase music books, many wonderful songs in the books lie undiscovered. This initiative provides an affordable way for churches to learn and play new music, with or without musicians.

The “Walk as One” songbook was published in 2022. The Worship Music packs provide a way for all churches, including songbook owners, to listen, learn and sing this excellent collection of songs.

Each music pack contains resources for 5 songs from the book. A new pack will be introduced every 2 months in 2024 – March, May, July, September, November.

Those who subscribe to all five packs will receive a bonus 4 songs during the year.

For each of the five songs in the music pack, you receive these digital resources

- A copy of the sheet music score from the “Walk as One” songbook (PDF)
- An audio recording of the song (high quality m3)
- A plain Powerpoint file (white text on black)
- A colour Powerpoint file (white text on coloured image)
- A lyric video (audio recording with song lyrics)
- A plain text version of the song lyrics (for inserting into presentation software or printed orders)

Liturgical use: Intercession (Prayers of the People)

Scripture reference/s: Year B: Psalm 139, 1 Samuel 3

A gentle, flowing song which, like the Psalms, reminds us that the rhythm of God's Creation is a sign of God's enduring love and care. A song to sing for others and for ourselves.

### ***Grant Us Your Grace***

Liturgical use: Confession and forgiveness

Scripture reference/s: Year B: Psalm 139, 1 Samuel 8:4-11

This reflective folk melody has a Taize-like chorus which could be sing repeatedly as a chant by itself. The song as a whole is a prayer of confession in itself, and could be followed by words of absolution.

The final verse and chorus invite us to extend that same welcome to others, particularly refugees. The wonderful recording can be used as a reflection piece by itself. Also suitable as a vocal item.
